

Pincher Creek Cabin

Overview

Pincher Creek cabin is a rustic log cabin built in the summer of 2008. The 14' x 16'7" log cabin sleeps four people comfortably. It is equipped with two bunk beds, table with benches, broom, shovel, water bucket, fire extinguisher, and a wood stove for heat.



AS OF 2016: “GO ANYWHERE TOILET KITS” OR WAG BAGS are now required at this site. Alaska DEC Regulations require outhouses to be placed at least 100 feet from water sources. The outhouse at Pincher Creek cabin did not meet this criterion and has been closed. Guests are required to purchase and bring “Go Anywhere Toilet Kits” also known as WAG BAGS when staying at the cabin. These bags are available for purchase online. More information on this system can be found [here](#). Bags should be removed and disposed of in normal trash after leaving the cabin. The current outhouse has been converted and is available to be used with this bag system. Enjoy the cabin and help us protect the surrounding environment by following these new protocols. Thank you!

Visitors will need to bring their own water for drinking, cooking, and cleaning purposes. Water taken from the stream must be treated or boiled prior to consumption. Visitors will need to bring their own bedding and sleeping pads, cooking gear and utensils, and other necessities. Bringing a personal cooking stove is recommended. All garbage and food must be packed out. Firewood is limited in the area and it is recommended to bring in your own dry firewood with you.

Recreation Opportunities



This cabin offers seclusion, hiking, photography, and waterfowl hunting. The area is home to a variety of wildlife, including moose, black and brown bears, and wolves. In the winter there is cross-county skiing and snowshoeing. Hunting is allowed. Review Alaska Department of Fish and Game hunting and fishing regulations for more details.

Special Considerations

The seclusion of this cabin necessitates being prepared for emergency situations. Inclement weather may cause an unexpected extension of the trip. Please plan accordingly.

Reservations

Directions

The cabin is located on the shore of Pincher Creek within the Chickaloon flats area. Access is by airplane on wheels or skis. Refer to USGS map Kenai D-1. GPS coordinates: Latitude 60 54.254, Longitude 150 12.082. (Degrees Decimal Minutes)
