## Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge to Host Pioneer Day Festival

Folkston, GA...The smell of a wood burning fire cooking down gallons of freshly-pressed cane juice, along with the sight of other traditional crafts and activities will greet visitors at the historic Chesser Island Homestead on Saturday, November 21<sup>st</sup> during the Pioneer Day Festival from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge. The Chesser Island Homestead is a premiere location to host an event like this, demonstrating the techniques used by the homesteaders of the early 20<sup>th</sup>-century using authentic tools and facilities. Visitors will be able to grind sugar cane using a traditional mule-powered grinder and sample the sweet cane juice. Samples of cane syrup along with biscuits will be provided, and jars of the syrup will be available for a donation.

More activities will be available to visitors at the Richard S. Bolt Visitor Center including wildlife and hunting exhibits, archery, kids crafts, and boat tours by Okefenokee Adventures. To add to the festivities, the refuge will be featuring special guests, IBEX Puppetry. Special features will include a workshop on endangered species, parades, puppet creation stations, and a 40 foot long inflatable alligator featuring a photo booth for photo opportunities.

Join in the festivities at the Chesser Island Homestead and the Richard S. Bolt Visitor Center and participate in all of the events of the day. With crafts, food, exhibits and information, and lots of fun activities for children, plan to bring the entire family and spend the day at the Main Entrance to the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge as we celebrate our annual Pioneer Day Festival.

All activities start inside the Main Entrance (Suwannee Canal Recreation Area) of Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge, 11 miles southwest of Folkston, Georgia, off the Okefenokee Parkway South (GA 121/23). A \$5 refuge entrance fee per vehicle or annual entrance pass required. For more information, contact the Richard S. Bolt Visitor Center at 912-496-7836, 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., daily.

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The Suwannee Canal Recreation Area (East Entrance) to the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge is the primary entrance managed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and is located 11 miles southwest of Folkston, GA off Hwy 121/23. The refuge is open daily and offers a variety of opportunities for the visiting public.
