Bombay Hook National Wildlife Refuge Releases for Public Review the Environmental Assessment for a Proposed Multi-use Facility and a Visitor Contact Station for the Coastal Delaware National Wildlife Refuge Complex

The Coastal Delaware National Wildlife Refuge Complex is seeking public review and comment on its draft Environmental Assessment for a Proposed Multi-use Facility and a Visitor Contact Station for the Coastal Delaware National Wildlife Refuge Complex. This Environmental Assessment (EA) provides an overview and comprehensive discussion on the proposal to design and construct a multi-use facility that will replace the current administrative headquarters and visitor center at Bombay Hook NWR and a visitor contact station that will replace the existing administration offices and visitor contact station at Prime Hook NWR. The public is invited to review the Draft Environmental Assessment. These documents will be available for a 14-day comment period.
