

CLARENCE CANNON NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE – Pike County, MO

Hours of Public Use	Where applicable, refuge lands are open for fishing, hunting furbearers, and general use from ½ hour before legal sunrise to ½ hour after legal sunset. For authorized hunting activities, the refuge is open two hours before legal sunrise until one hour after legal sunset.
Public Use Information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hiking allowed on refuge roads and trails, unless otherwise posted. ATVs/UTVs not allowed on the refuge. • Dogs must be on a leash except for hunting purposes (where hunting allowed). • Berry and mushroom gathering allowed for personal consumption only, not for resale or other commercial use. • Collecting shed deer antlers not allowed. • Camping or fires not permitted. • Gas boat motors prohibited on refuges. Electric motors and non-motorized watercraft allowed in designated areas for hunting and accessibility.
Firearms	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Allowed only during authorized hunting activities. Must be unloaded & either dismantled or cased when transporting on refuge roads or waters, unless in compliance with state concealed/carry regulations. • For hunting, you may ONLY use or possess approved nontoxic shot shells while in the field, including shot shells used for hunting wild turkey and upland game. • Target shooting or any non-hunting discharge of firearms prohibited.
Fishing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The taking of any mussel, clam, crayfish, leach, frog and turtle species is prohibited. • Allowed by boat in Bryants Creek ONLY.
Migratory Bird Hunting <i>(includes waterfowl and coot only)</i>	Closed to migratory bird hunting.
Upland Game	Closed to upland game hunting.
Turkey Hunting	Closed to turkey hunting.
Deer Hunting	Allowed ONLY during state-managed hunts and requires a refuge permit. See Missouri Department of Conservation for more information.
Trapping	Muskrat, beaver, and raccoon trapping permitted on all refuge lands, but requires a Refuge Special Use Permit.

GREAT RIVER NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE – Delair Division, Illinois (Pike County, IL)

Public Use Information	NO public use allowed, except during state-managed hunts.
Firearms	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Allowed only during authorized hunting activities. Must be unloaded & either dismantled or cased when transporting on refuge roads or waters, unless in compliance with state concealed/carry regulations. • For hunting, you may ONLY use or possess approved nontoxic shot shells while in the field, including shot shells used for hunting wild turkey and upland game. • Target shooting or any non-hunting discharge of firearms prohibited.
Fishing, Migratory Bird Hunting, Upland Game Hunting, Turkey Hunting, and Trapping	Closed to fishing, migratory bird hunting, upland game hunting, turkey hunting, and trapping.
Deer Hunting	Allowed ONLY during state-managed hunts and requires a refuge permit. See Illinois Department of Natural Resources for more information.

Hours of Public Use	<p>Where applicable, refuge lands are open for fishing, hunting furbearers, and general use from ½ hour before legal sunrise to ½ hour after legal sunset. For authorized hunting activities, the refuge is open two hours before legal sunrise until one hour after legal sunset.</p>
Public Use Information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hiking allowed on refuge roads and trails, unless otherwise posted. ATVs/UTVs not allowed on the refuge. • Dogs must be on a leash except for hunting purposes (where hunting allowed). • Berry and mushroom gathering allowed for personal consumption only, not for resale or other commercial use. • Collecting shed deer antlers not allowed. • Camping or fires not permitted. • Gas boat motors prohibited on refuges. Electric motors and non-motorized watercraft allowed in designated areas for hunting and accessibility.
Firearms	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Allowed only during authorized hunting activities. Must be unloaded & either dismantled or cased when transporting on refuge roads or waters, unless in compliance with state concealed/carry regulations. • For hunting, you may ONLY use or possess approved nontoxic shot shells while in the field, including shot shells used for hunting wild turkey and upland game. • Target shooting or any non-hunting discharge of firearms prohibited.
Fishing	<p><i>Hickory Creek Division and Cherry Box Division</i> – closed to fishing. <i>Fox Island Division</i> – bank fishing allowed along any portion of the Fox River from January 1 – October 15 and in accordance with state seasons and regulations. <i>Long Island Division and Slim & Haps Island Division</i> – fishing allowed in accordance with state seasons and regulations.</p>
Migratory Bird Hunting <i>(includes waterfowl and coot only)</i>	<p><i>Fox Island Division, Hickory Creek Division, and Cherry Box Division</i> – closed to migratory bird hunting. <i>Long Island Division</i> – allowed in accordance with state season and state and federal regulations. Hunting allowed ONLY from blinds constructed on sites posted by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources. <i>Slim & Haps Island Division</i> - allowed in accordance with state season and state and federal regulations.</p>
Upland Game	<p>Allowed for small game, furbearers, and game birds other than waterfowl in accordance with state seasons and regulations subject to the following conditions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hunting of furbearers allowed ONLY from 30 minutes before legal sunrise to 30 minutes after legal sunset. • On Hickory Creek and Cherry Box Divisions, upland game hunting is allowed with shotgun using nontoxic shot ONLY.
Turkey Hunting	<p><i>Long Island Division, Slim & Haps Island Division</i> - allowed in accordance with state season and regulations. <i>Cherry Box Division, Fox Island Division, and Hickory Creek Division</i> – allowed during the state spring season, youth season, & fall archery season. No fall firearms turkey hunting allowed.</p>
Deer Hunting	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Missouri Divisions</i> – allowed ONLY during the statewide archery deer season (closed during the statewide firearms deer season) in accordance with state regulations. NO firearms deer hunting allowed. • <i>Long Island Division</i> – allowed in accordance with Illinois state seasons & regulations. <p>Construction or use of permanent blinds, stands, scaffolds or platforms is prohibited.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Portable tree stands and blinds are allowed from September 1st through January 31st. The hunter’s state generated hunter ID number must be permanently attached in a visible location on the stand or blind. Limit one stand or blind per hunter. • Placing tree stands in dead trees is prohibited. • Trees or limbs greater than 1” in diameter may not be trimmed. • Deer drives are prohibited.
Trapping	<p>Muskrat, beaver, and raccoon trapping permitted on all refuge lands, but requires a Refuge Special Use Permit.</p>

Hours of Public Use	Where applicable, refuge lands are open for fishing, hunting furbearers, and general use from ½ hour before legal sunrise to ½ hour after legal sunset. For authorized hunting activities, the refuge is open two hours before legal sunrise until one hour after legal sunset.
Public Use Information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hiking allowed on refuge roads and trails, unless otherwise posted. Biking allowed only on refuge roads. ATVs/UTVs not allowed on the refuge. • Dogs must be on a leash except for hunting purposes (where hunting allowed). • Berry and mushroom gathering allowed for personal consumption only, not for resale or other commercial use. • Collecting shed deer antlers not allowed. • Camping or fires not permitted. • Gas boat motors prohibited on refuges. Electric motors and non-motorized watercraft allowed in designated areas for hunting and accessibility.
Firearms	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Allowed only during authorized hunting activities. Must be unloaded & either dismantled or cased when transporting on refuge roads or waters, unless in compliance with state concealed/carry regulations. • For hunting, you may ONLY use or possess approved nontoxic shot shells while in the field, including shot shells used for hunting wild turkey and upland game. • Target shooting or any non-hunting discharge of firearms prohibited.
Fishing	<p>Allowed according to state seasons and regulations subject to the following conditions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Must remove all fishing devices at the end of the day’s fishing activity. • Fishing is allowed from legal sunrise to legal sunset. • The taking of any mussel, clam, crayfish, leach, frog, and turtle species is prohibited.
Migratory Bird Hunting <i>(includes waterfowl and coot only)</i>	<p>Allowed ONLY on Meissner, Wilkinson, and Beaver Island Divisions, in accordance with state regulations and subject to the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Construction or use of permanent blinds, stands, scaffolds, or platforms prohibited. • Boats, blinds, blind materials, decoys, and other hunting equipment must be removed from the refuge at the end of each day.
Upland Game	Open to squirrels, rabbits & bobwhite quail only in accordance with state seasons and regulations.
Deer Hunting	<p>Open in accordance with state seasons and regulations. <i>*Hunters are strongly encouraged to have deer harvested from Beaver, Horse, or Crains Islands tested for CWD. CWD information is available at: https://www.dnr.illinois.gov</i></p> <p>Construction or use of permanent blinds, stands, scaffolds or platforms is prohibited.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Portable tree stands and blinds are allowed from September 1st through January 31st. The hunter’s state generated hunter ID number must be permanently attached in a visible location on the stand or blind. Limit one stand or blind per hunter. • Placing tree stands in dead trees is prohibited. • Trees or limbs greater than 1” in diameter may not be trimmed. • Deer drives are prohibited.
Turkey Hunting	<p>Open in accordance with state seasons and regulations, subject to the following conditions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Possession and use of approved nontoxic shot shells only.
Trapping	Muskrat, beaver, and raccoon trapping permitted on all refuge lands, but requires a Refuge Special Use Permit.
