Monday, October 10th

Hanalei NWR Hike

Join Refuge volunteer Louise Barnfield for a hike in the Hanalei National Wildlife Refuge. Get a glimpse of our endangered native wetland species in their habitat and learn about avian botulism and its impacts on them.

Tuesday, October 11th

Mōkōlea Point Hike
