Come enjoy the sights and sounds of Kilauea Point National Wildlife Refuge at no charge! The \$5 per adult entrance fee will be waived. Get a temporary tattoo, complete a Refuge Ranger activity sheet and get a Kilauea Point Jr. Ranger badge, learn about the FREE 4th grade pass, and visit our conservation partners:

- U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Ecological Services and a display of confiscated wildlife items
- Kaua'i Invasive Species Coalition
- Kaua'i Endangered Seabird Recovery Group
- Hawaiian Islands Humpback Whale National Marine Sanctuary
- Kaua'i Outdoor Painters Association

Come watch seabirds up close, check out native coastal plants and observe nēnē in their habitat. Binoculars are provided free of charge for wildlife observation.
