

Enjoy Your Visit!

The Refuge protects a vast complex of habitat for a variety of fish and wildlife and offers recreational opportunities for visitors to enjoy. To protect these resources and for your safety, please observe all regulations while visiting the Refuge. Thank you.



Day use only: Open daily from sunrise to sunset.



Visitor Center and Museum: Refuge brochures, maps, information and interpretive exhibits are available and located at Refuge Headquarters. The Visitor Center is open Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and staffed with volunteers, most weekends.

Auto Tour: The 42-mile auto tour (Center Patrol Road) offers prime wildlife viewing and interpretive opportunities on the Refuge. Self-guided auto tour brochures and media, and wildlife checklists are available.



Refuge Roads: Motorized vehicles and horseback riding are allowed only on designated roads shown on this map.



Trails: Hiking, bicycling and cross-country skiing are allowed only on designated roads and trails shown on this map. Refuge trails brochures are available.



Recreational Boating: Non-motorized or electric boats are allowed only on Krumbo Reservoir, and in designated hunt areas during the Malheur Lake hunt seasons.



Fishing & Hunting: Fishing and hunting are allowed only in designated areas shown on Refuge maps and by Refuge regulations. Fishing and hunting brochures are available.



Dogs: Dogs must be kept on leash while on the Refuge, except in designated hunt areas during the hunt seasons.



Weapons: Possession of weapons follows all State regulations on the Refuge. Discharge of weapons outside of the hunt seasons are prohibited.

Prohibited Activities: All-terrain vehicles (ATVs), camping, fires, swimming, and collecting natural objects such as plants, animals, minerals, antlers, and objects of antiquity (including Indian artifacts) are prohibited.
