

Willapa NWR provides an excellent opportunity for people to experience wildlife in a dynamic natural setting.

The Refuge consists of approximately 17,000 acres and is divided into several management units: Leadbetter Point Unit at the northern tip of Long Beach Peninsula; Long Island Unit in the middle part of the bay; East Hills Unit, consisting of Teal Slough, Headquarters, Greenhead Slough, and Bear River along the southeastern shore of Willapa Bay; and the South Bay Unit, consisting of Riekkola, Tarlatt, Porter's Point and Lewis at the south end of the bay.
