The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service will be filling four positions through the Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) program. *Applicants are not eligible if they turn 19 prior to the end date in early August and must be 15 by the starting date in early June.*

Projects include but are not limited to:

Nature Trail Construction and Maintenance
Building, Signage, and Grounds Maintenance
Observation Deck and Boardwalk Maintenance
Weed Control
Environmental Education

YCC members will learn about the different jobs in the Fish and Wildlife Service and the conservation of natural resources.

Two young men and two young women will be selected for these positions by a drawing which will be held in late April.**

Participants will do hard physical work and may be exposed to insects, poison oak and ivy, adverse weather, and difficult working conditions.
