### Endangered Species

Grades 3-6

Classroom 45 minute-1 hour

This program explores why species become threatened and endangered and what can be done to protect them. Through the use of a power point and actual wildlife items confiscated through the illegal world trade, we will look at both exotic species and some found in "our backyard."

### Creature Features—Build-a-Gator

Grades K-3

Classroom 45 minutes-1 hour


This program explores the biological principle of adaptation in some of Louisiana's native animals. Using props, a student will "model" adaptations of a wetland creature to illustrate its features. A live animal may be requested as an integral part of the program.

### Creature Features—Skulls

Grades 4-6

Classroom 45 minutes-1 hour

Students will work in teams to analyze basic differences between the skulls of native Louisiana carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. They will gain insight into how animals are adapted to respond to their life needs.

Grades 4-6
