




Hunting Regulations –Sept 1, 2013 – August 31, 2014

PERMITS: Season permits will be available at the information kiosks located at Mud Creek WMA and Coon Gulf Forever Wild Tract; season permits are also available at most local license agents or by writing Area Biologist Seth Maddox, 234 County Road 141, Hollywood, AL 35752 along with a self-addressed stamped #10 envelope. Phone (256) 437-2788. Permits will also be available online at www.outdooralabama.com (both pages of the internet map / permit must be in possession to be valid). Federal duck stamp and federal regulations may be obtained at U.S. Post Office. Alabama duck stamp may be obtained from Probate Judge's Office. Trapping permits must be obtained from the Area Biologist.

HUNTING DATES FOR CROW CREEK, MUD CREEK AND RACCOON CREEK WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREAS

WATERFOWL: Special Teal Season State Season; 6 a day - 18 in possession. 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset.
Special Early Goose Season State Season; 5 a day - 10 in possession. 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset.
Duck and Coot: State Season; 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset.
Goose: State Season; 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset.
Youth Day: State Season; 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset.

DOVE: State Season, 12:00 noon until sunset opening day, then 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset.

DEER: Archery Only Nov 2-10. Stalk Hunting Hunters' Choice (except spotted fawns). **One** deer per day. **Note:** Deer harvested on Saturday, **Nov. 2 and Saturday, Nov. 9**, must be presented at Checking Station (Coon Creek Outfitters) on Hwy 72, Stevenson, Alabama for data collection. During remaining hunt days, forms to record hunt data will be provided at local license agents.

SQUIRREL: Oct. 1-Feb. 28
QUAIL: Nov. 9-Feb. 28
BLACKBIRD, CROW & STARLING: Sept. 7-Feb. 28
RAIL, WOODCOCK & SNIPE: State Season.
RABBIT: Oct. 1-Feb. 28
RACCOON, OPOSSUM & FOX: Oct. 1-Feb. 28 (Nighttime Hours only: Fox hunting-dogs only-no weapons).
TRAPPING: Nov. 9-Feb. 28
BOW-FISHING: Mar. 1-Aug 31 and during other scheduled hunts - nongame fish only. Fishing license required.
FERAL SWINE - Archery Only: Mar. 1-14. Daylight hours only. No dogs allowed.

HUNTING DATES FOR COON GULF TRACT ONLY

DEER (Youth) Stalk Hunting Hunters' Choice (except spotted fawns): Nov. 16-17. **One** deer per day.

(Gun) Stalk Hunting Hunters' Choice (except spotted fawns): Dec. 20-21 and Jan. 17-18. **One** deer per day.
(Primitive Weapons) Stalk Hunting Hunters' Choice (except spotted fawns): Nov. 18-22. **One** deer per day.
(Archery) Stalk Hunting Hunters' Choice (except spotted fawns): Oct. 15-Jan. 31. **One** deer per day. NO HUNTING ON YOUTH DEER HUNT.

TURKEY: (Youth) March 29 (Daylight until 1:00 p.m.)
(Physically Disabled) March 31 (Daylight until 1:00 p.m.)
(Gun) April 1-30 (Daylight until 1:00 p.m.)

WATERFOWL: NO OPEN SEASON

ALL OTHER HUNT DATES FOR ALL OTHER GAME SAME AS ABOVE FOR JACKSON COUNTY MANAGEMENT AREAS.

HUNTING DATES FOR NORTH SAUTY AND CROW CREEK WATERFOWL REFUGES:

DOVE: 1st and 2nd Segments of State Season, 12:00 noon until sunset on opening day, then 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset.

DEER: Archery Only Nov 2-10. Stalk Hunting Hunters' Choice (except spotted fawns). One deer per day. **Note:** Deer harvested on Saturday, **Nov. 2 and Saturday, Nov. 9**, must be presented at checking station (Coon Creek Outfitters) on Hwy 72, in Stevenson, Alabama for data collection. Data collection forms will be provided at local license agents to record deer harvested during the entire nine-day archery hunt.

Nov. 9-Jan. 31 (water or land sets). Feb. 1-28 (water sets only).
Mar 1-Aug 31 and during other scheduled hunts-nongame fish only. Fishing license required.
NO OPEN SEASON
Mar. 1-14. Daylight hours only. No dogs allowed.

QUAIL: Oct. 1-31; Feb. 15-28.
SQUIRREL: Oct. 1-31; Feb. 15-28.
RABBIT: Oct. 1-31; Feb. 15-28.
RACCOON & OPOSSUM: Oct. 1-31.
TRAPPING: Nov. 9-Jan. 31 (water or land sets). Feb. 1-28 (water sets only).
BOW-FISHING: Mar 1-Aug 31 and during other scheduled hunts-nongame fish only. Fishing license required.
WATERFOWL: **NO OPEN SEASON**
FERAL SWINE - Archery Only: Mar. 1-14. Daylight hours only. No dogs allowed.

TIME FOR HUNTING:

Resident Game - Daylight hours except **Opossum & Raccoon**, which may be hunted at night: **Dove** - 12:00 noon until sunset opening day, then 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset. **Rail, Woodcock, Snipe**, - 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset. **Waterfowl** - 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset. All unauthorized activity prohibited in the dewatering units from 7:00 p.m. until 12:00 a.m. (midnight) each day (Nov. 1-Feb. 15) and 48 hours prior to waterfowl season openings.

BAG LIMITS: **Waterfowl** - 6 ducks a day and may include no more than 4 Mallards (no more than 2 of which may be a female), 3 Wood Ducks, 1 Mottled Duck, 1 Black Duck, 2 Redhead, and 2 Pintail, 2 Canvasback and 3 Scaup; the possession limit is twice the daily bag limit. **Squirrel** - 8 a day; **Quail** - 12 a day; **Rabbit** - 8 a day; **Raccoon** - 5 per person per day; **Opossum** - no limit; **Dove** - 15 a day; **Snipe** - 8 a day; **Rail** - 15 a day; **Woodcock** - 3 a day. **Deer** - 2 deer per day, only one of which may be an antlered buck (no spotted fawns).
Falconry: Falconry will be legal on all scheduled area hunts for legally permitted falconers (must possess state and management area hunting licenses and management area permit). Falconers must adhere to bag limits and hunting season dates as listed above for resident and migratory game birds and animals (except no more than 3 migratory birds per day).

PERMITTED FIREARMS & ARCHERY EQUIPMENT:

Duck, Merganser & Goose: Shotguns 10 gauge or smaller using T size steel shot or smaller or with other U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service approved shot and sizes.
Dove, Snipe, Rail, & Woodcock: Shotguns using No. 2 shot or smaller.
Quail: Shotguns using No. 4 shot or smaller.
Squirrel, Rabbit, Blackbirds, Crow, & Starling: Shotguns using No. 4 shot or smaller, .22 caliber or smaller rimfire firearms, or rifles operated by air.
Raccoon & Opossum: Shotguns using No. 4 shot or smaller or .22 caliber or smaller rimfire firearms (daylight hunting). Must comply with state law and regulation (night hunting).
Deer: Legal archery equipment as specified by Alabama Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Division Regulation.
Trapping: On all scheduled hunts, archery will be legal. Broadhead points permitted only during archery season. Archery equipment must comply with state regulations.
Bow-Fishing: Standard .22 caliber rimfire firearms (no magnums) only during daylight hours only. All trappers must comply with all state laws and regulations pertaining to trapping.
LEGAL METHODS AND EQUIPMENT AS SPECIFIED BY ALABAMA WILDLIFE AND FRESHWATER FISHERIES DIVISION REGULATION.

IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL:

- To hunt, trap, use dogs, possess firearms, ammunition, traps or archery equipment, except bow fishing equipment from March 1-August 31 or bow hunting equipment from March 1-14 (hog season) without a valid permit. A permit is valid only during scheduled management and refuge area seasons during legal hunting hours and only with weapons and ammunition permitted for hunting the wildlife listed on permit.
 - To use dogs for hunting, training or any purpose from March 1 to the opening of the following fall gun season.
 - For any person under 16 years of age to hunt on the management area unless accompanied by a licensed hunter at all times.
 - For any person to carry firearms in or on vehicle with ammunition in the magazine, breech or clip attached to firearms.
 - To camp in the management area except in designated sites. Individuals or groups may camp on the management area for a period not to exceed nine (9) days in any 30 day period. Campfires must be extinguished before departing. No warming fires shall be permitted away from camping area.
 - To kill or willfully molest any species of wildlife except those designated for hunting. However, this regulation shall not apply to feral swine, or coyote which may be killed during all scheduled management area hunts, during daylight hours only, when possessing a valid permit and using weapons and ammunition that are legal for such designated hunts.
 - To kill or willfully molest bobcat. However, bobcat may be killed during the scheduled area hunt that occurs during the dates of the archery deer season, when possessing a valid permit and using weapons and ammunition that are legal for such designated hunts during daylight hours only.
 - To discharge fireworks at any time.
 - To discharge firearms for target practice at any location on these Management Areas & Refuges.
 - To hunt or discharge firearms within 150 yards of any camping area, dwelling, dam or timber operation, or within 100 yards of any paved public road, highway, or within a posted safety zone, or within one-half mile of a church on Sunday.
 - To use fire to smoke out game.
 - For any person except authorized personnel to operate any motor driven vehicle behind, under or around any locked gate, barricaded road or sign which prohibits vehicular traffic.
 - For any unauthorized person at any time to operate a motor scooter, motorcycle, trail bike, or **any motor driven vehicle** on the management area except on regularly used roads open for public use by four wheel vehicle traffic.
 - For any person except authorized personnel to block or otherwise stop traffic on any road by parking a vehicle in such a way that passage around the vehicle is impossible.
 - To deposit, distribute or scatter grain, salt, litter, or any other materials on management area prior to receiving approval from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.
 - To damage or remove any trees, crops or other plants, dirt, gravel or sod from management area without legal authorization.
 - For any person to take, catch, kill or attempt to take, catch, or kill mussels during the waterfowl hunting season.
 - To hunt from an elevated stand or platform without attaching themselves to the tree or platform with a full body harness capable of supporting their weight
- The following regulations will apply to the Green Tree Reservoir and the dewatering slough within the Mud Creek and Raccoon Creek Wildlife Management Area, and North Sauty and Crow Creek Refuges.**
- To leave their vehicle parked at the approved launching sites; hunters must use the designated parking areas.
 - For any person using a boat in the harvest of waterfowl within the dewatering slough to leave boat overnight unless it has been floated to an approved launching site for overnight mooring.
 - To take fish for commercial purposes and/or to use commercial fishing gear within any dewatering unit from Nov. 1-Jan. 31 of each fiscal year.
 - For any person using duck and/or goose decoys in the Greentree Reservoir and the Mud Creek and Raccoon Creek Dewatering Units to leave said decoys overnight.
 - For unauthorized persons to use airboats on the Greentree Reservoir and the dewatering sloughs at any time and mud motors or airboats on those portions of North Sauty and Crow Creek Refuges lying North of Hwy. 72 from Nov. 1 to Jun. 30.
- NOTE:** Temporary blinds may be used for one day only. All such blinds, except boat blinds, left in said areas for more than one day shall be disposed of as deemed advisable by the Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Division of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.
The construction or usage of permanent blinds requiring building material, flooring and/or flotation materials shall not be permitted in or within 150 yards of the Mud Creek and Raccoon Creek dewatering units and the Greentree Reservoir.
THIS MANAGEMENT AREA WAS ESTABLISHED BY THE ALABAMA WILDLIFE AND FRESHWATER FISHERIES DIVISION IN COOPERATION WITH THE TENNESSEE VALLEY AUTHORITY.
A hunting license (or Wildlife Heritage License for small game, except waterfowl), management area permit and management area license (when hunting deer & waterfowl) are required when hunting on management areas.
