Biological Science Interns will be selected to work at Cape May National Wildlife Refuge. This is a fantastic opportunity to work in the biological field assisting with various wildlife surveys such as shorebird, fish, and bats, controlling invasive plant species, participating in salt marsh fieldwork, and learn the fundamentals of maintenance on a national wildlife refuge. This internship will provide invaluable experience in the biological field and an understanding of the work required to run a national wildlife refuge. This work will help you stand out in future job applications. This position offers some monetary assistance.

Who?

Applicants must be willing to:

- work in hot, humid, buggy weather
- work early morning/ late nights
- be physically capable of walking in salt marshes carrying heavy equipment
- be able to learn wildlife by sight and sound
- effectively interact with people
- be a safety-minded team player

A biology or wildlife background is required. Applicants must be able to supply their own housing. All ages welcome.

When?

April – Sept. 2020

8 hours/day

Interns are needed for 8 hrs/day, minimum of 3 days/week, preference will be given to applicants able to work 40 hrs/week.
