

# Dunes Hike

## Guadalupe-Nipomo Dunes National Wildlife Refuge

Friday, 23 May 2014 • 9:30 am - 1:30 pm





The Dunes Center and U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service will be jointly hosting a 4 - 5 mile long interpretive hike into the back dunes of the wildlife refuge. This hike will provide an opportunity to visit scenic portions of the wildlife refuge that are usually difficult to access.

The entrance gates for this special event are located on Oso Flaco Lake Road approximately 2.4 miles west of Highway 1, which is about 0.7 mile east of the Oso Flaco Lake parking lot. This location is about 6 miles northwest of Guadalupe and 7 miles west of Nipomo.

Bring hiking boots, hat, sunblock, water, binoculars, camera, light jacket, and a light lunch. Since we will be hiking in the back dunes where scratchy brush and poison oak are common, long pants and long sleeves are suggested.

Please note: 1) This hike will involve moderate and occasionally difficult physical exertion over soft sand and steep ridges. Young children and anyone with medical limitations should not attend. 2) Pets, tobacco products, and alcoholic beverages are not permitted on the wildlife refuge, including the parking area.
