Conserving America's Wildlife!

Come visit Shiawassee National Wildlife Refuge. This 9,800-acre wildlife magnet contains a diverse array of forests, fields, wetlands, rivers, and open-water habitats. Whether bird watching, fishing, hiking, hunting, participating in an educational program, or taking pictures, there are many ways to enjoy the refuge!

Over 13 miles of trails are open sunrise to sunset, seven days a week, except during hunting seasons. A self-guided, 7-1/2 mile auto tour route, the Wildlife Drive, is open sunrise to sunset from May 1-October 5. A boat launch along the Cass River, off of Highway M-13, provides access for small boats and plenty of fishing room for anglers. Goose and deer hunting in the fall and winter are by permit only. Special events are held throughout the year. Green Point Environmental Learning Center offers educational programs to groups on a reservation basis.

Brochures, public use regulations and species lists are available at the refuge headquarters and on our website. Office hours are Monday-Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
