Requirements


The cooperator will be required to maintain the fence. Cooperator is encouraged to check the condition of the fences prior to bidding. Should the cooperator need to repair the permanent barbed wire fence, the materials will be provided by the US Fish & Wildlife Service. It is preferred that the cooperator use their own materials and keep track of what they use on the WPA and the US Fish & Wildlife Service will reimburse the cooperator with new materials. Should the cooperator choose to use electric fence, the cooperator will be required to use their own materials.

***A prescribed fire is planned for this unit. Please allow some flexibility due to the timing of the burn. The turn in date maybe adjusted to allow for green up.**

Special conditions are:

1. You supply and install e-fencing for perimeter and x-fence.
2. You maintain all fencing and may replace fencing (permanent and temporary) as needed. Refuge will supply all materials for permanent and you acquire materials for temporary (e-fencing) as done in 2018.
3. Grazing may be shortened or lengthened dependent upon growing and environmental conditions.
