2021 STRAZZULLA ARCHERY AND CROSSBOW DEER AND HOG HUNT

Supplemental Information in addition to 2021 Hunting Regulations

Hunt Dates:

August 6-8, 2021.

Hunting Hours

Hunters may enter the Refuge at the Headquarters Area entrance in Boynton Beach beginning at 4:00 am each hunt day. Hunting will be permitted from ½ hour before sunrise to ½ hour after sunset.

Hunt Area

A Strazzulla Deer/Hog Hunt Permit is required for a hunter who intends to archery or crossbow hunt white-tailed deer and feral hog at the Strazzulla Unit of the Arthur R. Marshall Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge. Hunting is prohibited within 300 feet of private lands for any hunting in Strazzulla. We prohibit hunting or shooting from the L-40 levee.

Refuge Hunt Permit

All hunters must possess and carry a signed Refuge Hunt Permit (signed hunt brochure) while hunting. Visit our hunting webpage to download the hunt brochure.

Scouting

Hunters may access the L-40 Levee from the Headquarters Area entrance in Boynton Beach from 6:00 am to 8:00 pm on July 30-August 1, 2021.

Vehicles and Parking

To park along the L-40 levee, hunters must use the Headquarters Area entrance in Boynton Beach, FL. Hunters must sign a South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) Liability Release (available onsite each hunting/scouting day) to access the L-40 levee for parking.

Hunters who have signed a SFWMD Liability Release* will travel approximately 4.25 miles on the L-40 levee to reach the parking area. Hunters must park between latitude lines 26.5564° and 26.5925° along the L-40 levee. Hunters should pull far enough off the road to allow for a large, dump-truck sized vehicle to pass. Standard or stock vehicles only, no modified vehicles. Parking in front of gates or impeding traffic is prohibited.

Vehicles may not exceed 25 MPH on any Refuge road.

We prohibit the use of ATVs, motorized off-road vehicles, and amphibious vehicles.

Operating bicycles off designated roads and trails is prohibited.

Tree Stands and Blinds

Hunters may place their blinds during scouting. We only allow portable or temporary tree stands and blinds while hunting. We prohibit hunting from a permanently constructed tree stand or blind. We prohibit paint or any other permanent marker to mark trails and the use of tacks, screw-in steps, spikes, or other objects that may damage trees. We require hunters to remove all tree stands and blinds, marking devices, flagging or tape, on their last hunt day.

Harvest Reporting

All deer harvested must be reported in accordance with State regulations.
