

Bear River Migratory Bird Refuge Hosts Summer Refuge Tours and Nature Film Saturdays

The Bear River Migratory Bird Refuge invites the public to participate in our summer Guided Refuge Tours. These guided tours are a great way to see the Refuge in the summer and are FREE. You will not only see our birds, but learn about them as well. Howard Browers, Wildlife Biologist states, “The viewing right now is amazing with all the bird babies”.

Each tour is led by a guide, with vast knowledge of the Refuge and its birds, and one of our fantastic drivers. Make sure to pack bug spray and sunscreen as you might be getting out of the van to observe birds through a spotting scope. There are binoculars and bird guides to borrow, but we encourage you to bring your own. Tours run from May 30th-August 28th. They are held on Saturdays, only, and last from 10:00am-1:00pm. All Participants must be 8yrs or older. Prior registration is required. Participants can register by contacting Andrea Johnson at: 435-734-6426. Registered guests are to meet their guide and driver at the James V. Hansen Wildlife Education Center prior to the start of their tour.

Cool off at the Center with Nature Film Saturdays, beginning July 4, and running through August 28, 2015. All films will run 1:00 p.m.—3:00 p.m. and are FREE. Registration not required.
