Bear River Refuge open for Youth Waterfowl Hunt Day

As of September 1, low river levels present Refuge staff with challenging water management. Units within the Auto Tour Route, including 2B, 2C, and 2D are low and filling. The northern portion of Duckville Units, including 3A, 3-I, and 3J are also filling. It is anticipated that water levels will be good in these units by the Youth Waterfowl Hunt Day, September 17. Wildlife Biologist, Howard Browers, states “The large number of waterfowl we’re seeing this year is impressive!”
