GPS Adventure

1. Headquarters

36.879248, -88.344914

The cache is near the Refuge Headquarters. The office is open Monday – Friday from 7 am until 3:30 pm except on federal holidays. Visitors are welcome!

2. EERA

36.855820, -88.333245

This cache is located at our Environmental Education and Recreation Area (EERA) just east of the city of Benton. There is a little walk to the cache, but it is a paved walk around our fishing pond. This area is open to the public 7 days a week during daylight hours. Feel free to explore the rest of the EERA once you find the cache!

3. Happy Hollow

36.890481, -88.353332

This Cache is at some of the only uplands on the Clarks River National Wildlife Refuge. Uplands are areas where the elevation is high enough it does not flood. In fact, it is the highest point in Marshall County. This is also one of the stops on our auto tour, so if you would like to learn more feel free to call the number on the auto tour signs located in the parking area. Stop by headquarters for a brochure on the auto tour.

***While the road is paved it is a fairly steep incline and can be slick in wet/icy conditions. This is a micro cache so bring your own pen/pencil. ***

4. Bird Banding Lab

36.927902, -88.464069

This cache is located at the Clarks River National Wildlife Refuge's songbird banding lab. Staff and volunteers band migratory song birds once every 10 days from May until August every year. There is no need to go in the lab to find the cache.
