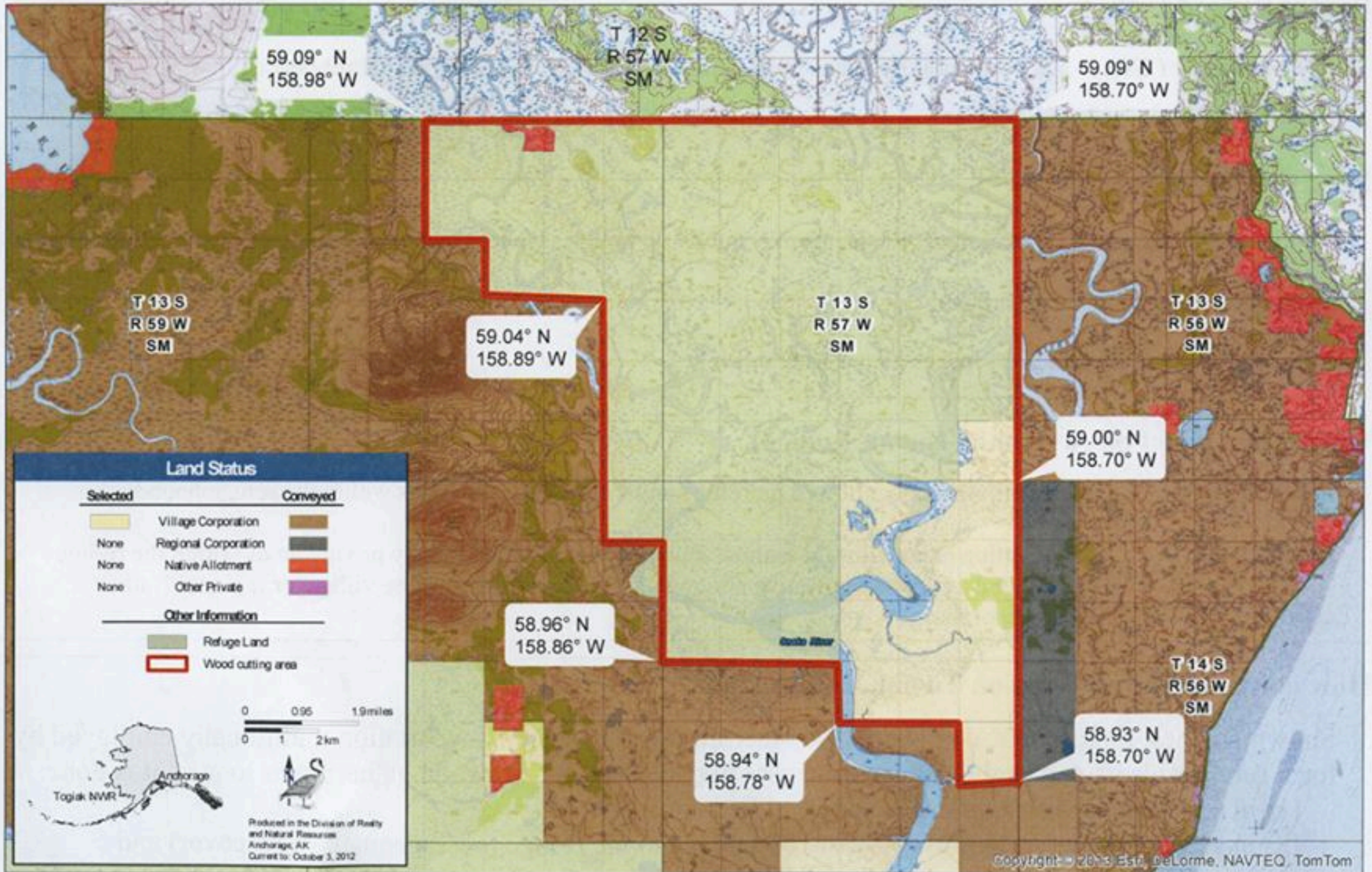

Who may cut wood on Togiak Refuge lands?

Local Rural Residents

What wood may be on Togiak Refuge lands?

Commercial Use	
Live Standing Timber	Dead or Downed Timber
Prohibited	Prohibited

Non Commercial Use	
Live Standing Timber	Dead or Downed Timber
Local Rural Residents may cut live timber less than 3 inches in diameter as measured 54 inches above ground level - no permit needed.	Local Rural Residents may gather firewood of any size - no permit needed.

Where may wood be cut within Togiak Refuge?

Refuge Lands:

Cutting is only allowed on refuge and village selected lands within the refuge boundary.

Private Lands:

Cutting is not allowed without landowner permission on any private lands within the refuge boundary including Native allotments, and lands conveyed to village or regional Native corporations.

How may wood be accessed on Togiak Refuge lands?

Snowmachines, motorboats, dog teams and other means of surface transportation traditionally employed by local rural residents engaged in subsistence uses may be used for firewood gathering as long as it is done:

- (1) in compliance with applicable State and Federal law,
- (2) in such a manner as to prevent waste or damage to the refuge (e.g. adequate snow cover) and
- (3) in such a manner as to prevent the herding, harassment, hazing or driving of wildlife.
