2014 Youth Waterfowl Hunt

Savannah National Wildlife Refuge's 13th annual youth waterfowl hunt is scheduled for three consecutive Saturdays in November and December 2014. This hunt will be managed entirely within a part of the former Solomon Tract (Oak Grove Bluff) located in Chatham County, Georgia about four miles west of Port Wentworth off Georgia Highway 21. Participants in the youth hunt will be selected by random drawing. No more than two youths may apply as a party with one adult supervisor. There will be three separate hunt days: November 29, December 6, and December 13, 2014. **Adult supervisors will not be allowed to hunt.**

The attached map outlines the area within the refuge designated for the youth waterfowl hunt, and provides directions to the Oak Grove Bluff entrance gate. **For further information regarding the refuge or hunt management, please visit www.fws.gov/refuge/savannah or contact the Savannah Coastal Refuges Complex office at 843/784-2468.**

APPLICATION INFORMATION & INSTRUCTIONS

Please read the following rules and regulations before completing the permit application for the youth waterfowl hunt on Savannah National Wildlife Refuge.

The hunt will be limited to a maximum of 12 youth hunters (two per blind) per day who will be selected by drawing. All applications must be received at the Savannah Coastal Refuges Complex (SCRC) office by August 31, 2014 to be entered in the drawing which will be held on September 5, 2014.

Eligibility requirements: Applicants for the youth waterfowl hunt must be 15 years of age or younger at the time of the hunt.

To Apply: Request or download the **Savannah NWR Youth Waterfowl Hunt Application (FWS Form 3-2355)**. Fill in the application date and all personal information requested in the top half of the form (name, address, phone number, email address). Also fill in the three "Hunt Date Choices" ranked in the order you prefer (most hunters will be selected for at least one of the three available dates). All other fields should be left "as is". Both youth hunter and adult guardian need to sign the application. If you received the form electronically, please print it out. Mail all applications to:

Only one application may be submitted per youth hunter; applicants who apply more than once for the hunt will be rejected. Only complete and correct applications will be included in the drawing. Only selected applicants will be notified following the drawing.

Two youths may apply as a party however, each youth must fill out his/her own application. Once the applications are complete, staple them together and mail in the same envelope.

A \$5.00 application fee per hunter is required at the time the application is submitted.

***Accepted payment methods are credit/debit cards (call 843/784-9911 to pay by phone), cashiers check or money order (made payable to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.) No personal checks will be accepted.**

Hunt permits are non-transferable, valid only for the individual whose name appears on the permit.

SPECIFIC HUNTING REGULATIONS

All Georgia waterfowl hunting regulations will apply in addition to more restrictive, specific refuge regulations which are listed.

Each youth hunter or youth party (two youths) must be accompanied by one adult who will participate in a non-hunting capacity. The supervising adult must be 21 years of age or older, and must remain in sight and normal voice contact with the youth hunter/hunters. The adult may supervise no more than two youths.

All youths/parties and their supervisors must arrive at the Oak Grove Bluff gate by 5:30 a.m. on each hunt day for check-in, orientation, and blind assignments.

Hunters will be placed in one of six blinds, and access to these may require wading or paddling a flat bottom boat (provided by the refuge). Hip-waders are recommended.

Shooting hours will be from ½ hour before sunrise until noon. Hunters are responsible for removing all used shells.

Dogs may be used to retrieve waterfowl, but they must be under control at all times.

Decoys may be used but cannot be left on the refuge overnight.
