Enclosed are copies of the Final Certificates of Apportionment under the provisions of the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration Act and the Dingell-Johnson Sport Fish Restoration Act, as amended. These apportionments are for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2019, and are available for the periods of time specified in the Acts.

These final apportionments are based on deposits into the Wildlife Restoration Fund and the Sport Fish Restoration and Boating Trust Fund during Fiscal Year 2019. The amounts reflect sequestered amounts of \$21,680,693 in the Sport Fish Restoration Trust Fund and \$36,226,610 in the Wildlife Restoration Trust Fund for 2020. In addition, \$41,800,841 in the Wildlife Restoration Trust Fund and \$22,420,929 in the Sport Fish Restoration Trust Fund that were sequestered in FY 2019 have been apportioned for your use.

The Service is pleased to make these funds available to you. If you have questions about the apportionments, please contact the Fish and Wildlife Service Regional Director for your area.

STATES, THE COMMONWEALTH OF PUERTO RICO,  
GUAM, THE U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS, AMERICAN SAMOA,  
AND THE COMMONWEALTH OF THE NORTHERN  
MARIANA ISLANDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020.

Pursuant to the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration (Act), as amended (16 U.S.C. 669 et seq.), I have, at this time, apportioned \$601,827,014 to the States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. The funds so apportioned are based on the amount credited during Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 to the Federal Aid to Wildlife Restoration Fund. This includes \$41,800,841 that was sequestered in 2019 and is now available. A preliminary apportionment of \$451,559,757 was made on November 19, 2019, and is included as a part of this final apportionment. The funds are available for the FY beginning October 1, 2019, and are available for the periods specified in 16 U.S.C. 669 et seq.

Of the total amount apportioned, I have made \$474,003,513 available to the States as provided by Section 669c(b). This amount includes \$32,615,337 of 2019 sequestered funds. The amounts apportioned to the States are adjusted so that no State shall receive more than 5 percent or less than one-half of 1 percent of the amount apportioned under Section 669c(b). This apportioned amount also includes \$626,478 of previously apportioned "Section 10" funding that was not obligated within the time identified by Section 669h-1(c)(1) which I have made available in accordance with Section 669h-1(c)(2), apportioning this amount in accordance with Section 669c(b). Amounts apportioned to the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands are as provided by Section 669g-1.

Of the total amount apportioned, I have made \$119,799,501 available as provided by Section 669c(c) and 669g(b). This includes \$7,793,527 of 2019 sequestered funds. The amounts apportioned to the States are adjusted so that no State shall receive more than 3 percent or less than 1 percent of the total apportioned under Section 669c(c). In addition to other authorized uses of these funds, amounts apportioned under subsection 669c(c) may be used for hunter recruitment and recreational shooter recruitment.

Of the total amount apportioned, I have made \$8,024,000 available as provided by Section 669h-1(a)(1). This amount includes \$496,000 of 2019 sequestered funds. The amounts apportioned to the States are adjusted so that no State shall receive more than 3 percent or less than 1 percent of the total apportioned under Section 669h-1(a)(1). Amounts apportioned to the States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands are as provided by Section 669c(c). Amounts apportioned under subsection 669h-1(a)(1)(A) may be used for hunter recruitment and recreational shooter recruitment.

Therefore, in accordance with the above, the final apportionment of Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restorations funds for FY2020 is as shown on the enclosed table.

Additional deductions from the Wildlife Restoration Fund and amendments to previous apportionments include:

- Sequestration** – A total of \$36,226,610 has been temporarily sequestered from the Wildlife Restoration Fund and will be available for apportionment next year.
- Multi-State Conservation Grant Program** – A total of \$8,000,000 was directed into the Multi-State Conservation Grant Program.
- FWS Administration** – A total of \$11,645,919 was withheld for FWS Administrative Support.
- North American Wetlands Conservation Account** – The investment of available Wildlife Restoration Funds yielded \$49,632,582 in accrued interest that was transferred to the North American Wetlands Conservation Account.

**Migratory Bird Conservation Fund** – A total of \$13,403,669 of previously apportioned Wildlife restoration funds that were not obligated within the timeframes set forth in Section 669b(a)(1). In accordance with that Section, these reverted funds have been transferred to the FWS Migratory Bird Conservation Fund.
