ADMINISTRATION

Agendum 1. Review and approval of agenda

Members reviewed and approved the agenda (*Handout A*).

Agendum 2. Adoption of minutes from October 2000 meeting

Mike Orcutt and Dave Hillemeier requested changes to the October 2000 minutes. Keith Wilkinson asked that this agendum be postponed until staff could distribute copies of those edits to members for review. Jennifer Silveira asked members to review the February 2001 minutes (*Handout B*) for approval at the April 2001 meeting.

Agendum 3. Review Handouts

Jennifer Silveira reviewed the handouts (*see attached list*).

REPORTS FROM THE KLAMATH RIVER TECHNICAL ADVISORY TEAM (KRTAT)

Agendum 5. Results of running the Harvest Rate Model using a conservative age-4 stock prediction and the actual 2000 hatchery/natural spawner ratio

KRTAT chair George Kautsky introduced Michael Mohr, who reported on the KRTAT's analysis (see *Handout C*). Michael Mohr referred to the first page of the handout and explained how the natural spawner escapement goal is set each year. This year, because we are not managing for the floor, the goal will be only 1/3 of the natural spawner escapement, which is about 47,000. He explained the second page of the handout, showing Harvest Rate Model results using the age 4 prediction from the KRTAT stock abundance report (197,500) versus a conservative prediction derived by forcing the regression through the 1992 data point (164,611), and using the 2000 proportion of natural spawners (46%) versus the five-year average (63%). George Kautsky said that the KRTAT has not found bias in the stock abundance predictor, and even if the prediction is inaccurate, in the worst case situation (as represented by the model run using the conservative prediction and the 46% natural spawner proportion) natural spawners would still clear the 35,000 floor.

Agendum 4. Analysis of appropriate hatchery/natural spawner ratio to use in 2001

George Kautsky said that KRTAT found a promise of some relationship in the ratio of hatchery and natural spawners, but the team has not fully developed a rationale or logic for that relationship. For this year, the team supports using the five-year average.

Agendum 6. Results of running the Klamath Ocean Harvest Model using the 2001 ocean stock prediction with the 2000 fisheries option

The KRTAT had not finished the model runs, so this item was deferred until the next day.

Agendum 7. Public comment

Jim Welter, of the Salmon Advisory Subpanel (SAS) said the Oregon Klamath Management Zone (KMZ) fishery wants options to take to the SAS at their meeting on Monday instead of waiting until the last minute. Keith Wilkinson asked Jim Welter for copies of sport and troll options for the KMZ developed by the Klamath Zone Coalition. Jim Welter provided copies (*Handout D*).

2001 Management Season**Agendum 8. Past KFMC protocol for years when the ocean fisheries cannot harvest their full allocation**

Members reviewed and discussed information put together by staff (*Handout E*): 1) The KFMC's recommendation to the PFMC on March 10, 1996, 2) an excerpt from the December 9, 1999 minutes (Agendum 22), and 3) a memo from Dan Viele dated December 6, 1999.

Agendum 9. Action: Develop a range of options for the 2001 management season, for discussion with Salmon Advisory Subpanel and presentation to the Pacific Fishery Management Council

LB Boydston referred members to a draft recommendation from the KFMC to the PFMC he wrote based on the KFMC's recommendation from March 2000 (*Handout F*).

Technical Advisory Team (KRTAT) Reports

Agendum 6 (continued). Results of running the Klamath Ocean Harvest Model using the 2001 ocean stock prediction with the 2000 fisheries option

Allen Grover presented the results of two runs of the Klamath Ocean Harvest Model (see *Handout H*). The first run used the 2001 stock projection with the 2000 fisheries option. That run gave a tribal harvest and a non-tribal harvest of 47,200 fish each, and 83,800 natural spawners. The second run used the 2001 stock projection and the 2001 options, except for the river recreational fishery, which was allowed to go as high as possible until the number of natural spawners hit 47,000 (the natural spawner floor for 2001). That run gave a river recreational fishery allocation of 46% of the non-tribal share, or 34,800 fish. The tribal harvest and non-tribal harvest rose to 74,900 fish each.

Motion passed unanimously.

The staff was assigned to edit the recommendations document and give it to the PFMC staff.

Members discussed Issue 6 of Handout J, and agreed to work more on this at the April meeting.

Agendum 12 (continued). Public comment

Jerry Barnes said that after more than 20 years working on fish habitat in the Klamath Basin, he believes there is no such thing as a harvestable surplus. He said high escapement is not well distributed throughout the basin. In 1986 we had 146,000 natural spawners, but only 2,700 adults returned to the Salmon River. This year only 1500 adults spawned in the Salmon River. In 1986, 93,000 of those 146,000 natural spawners were in the upper 22 miles of the Trinity River, mostly in the 5 miles below the hatchery. There was superposition of redds, eggs all over the river, and mortality because the habitat capacity was exceeded. The same thing probably happened in Bogus Creek this year. LB Boydston was co-author of a 1985 habitat assessment analysis that estimated the capacity of the basin at 186,000 natural spawners. One of the purposes of adopting harvest rate management was to test the capacity of the basin with some high escapements, but the high escapements have been poorly distributed. We don't know why the high escapements of 1986-1989 did not result in high recruitment. Ocean conditions and poor water quality in the Klamath may have been factors. Another purpose of harvest rate management was to rebuild natural stocks. Hatcheries are for mitigating for habitat lost by dams. Unfortunately, because wild stocks have lower productivity per female than hatchery fish, when you get a high wild return, you get surplus hatchery fish. He said he was glad the KFMC proposed putting a portion of the harvestable surplus (*See Handout J, Issue 6*) to escapement.

Jim Welter said that without enough water in the basin's rivers, there will be poor distribution of high escapements. We had massive returns from the low spawner escapements of 1982-1985, because we had plenty of water and good distribution in those years. We've also had low recruitment resulting from high escapement in low water years. He said that since this is will be a dry year, we might as well harvest those fish.

Dave Hillemeier said he had not completed the draft letter regarding the BOR's BA for Klamath coho. The letter will be addressed to NMFS, with a cc to BOR.

Keith Wilkinson recapped the history of the long term funding initiative since it began two years ago. Mike Orcutt explained that there is a lot of money coming in for salmon, but it is not all in the right categories where we need it, especially in the monitoring category. There are opportunities for integrating the different sources of funding if the different parties coordinate. We need to get involved with the coordination group established by the Hatfield legislation. Dave Hillemeier requested an April agenda item on short-term funding needs for Klamath monitoring

Staff was assigned to add to the April agenda an item on short-term funding needs for Klamath monitoring.

Paul Kirk asked Allen Grover to step forward from the audience and tell members of the progress the STT had made in modeling options. Grover distributed a handout showing KOHM runs of the three PFMC options (*Handout M*). He said they all worked out well with respect to harvest share and will go to the PFMC.

Agendum 18. Action: Develop range of options for presentation to the PFMC (members)

Members discussed the harvestable surplus and how ocean fisheries will be constrained from catching their full share. They agreed that the model runs presented by Allen Grover did not give a complete picture of the

situation. Michael Mohr said the model runs were a PFMC assignment and should not be interpreted as final. Dave Bitts made a motion with Keith Wilkinson seconding for discussion: That ocean fisheries (Oregon troll, California troll, and KMZ sport) agree that the uncatchable part of the available surplus be rolled over in its entirety to the in-river fishery. Motion was withdrawn.

Keith Wilkinson made a motion with Dave Bitts seconding: That the letter to Mr. Olson be approved in its entirety. The motion passed unanimously.

Steve King pointed out a couple of typographical errors.

Staff was assigned to print a final draft of the letter to Todd Olson, have Paul Kirk to sign it as vice chair, and mail it.

Agendum 14 (continued). Letter regarding the Bureau of Reclamation's (BOR) Biological Assessment (BA) of Klamath coho

Staff distributed a revised draft of the letter (*Handout O*). Dave Hillemeier asked that a subject line be added. Mike Orcutt asked that the word "negligently" be removed, and that the sentence referring to fish kills be put back in. Dan Viele said the sentence had been removed because it was poorly written.

Dave Bitts proposed another version of the sentence: "Substantial fish kills have occurred in years when flows were higher than those proposed in the BA."

Mike Orcutt suggested the KFMC ask for a mechanism to alleviate water quality problems when "red flags" appear.

Dave Bitts proposed this language: "The KFMC urges NMFS to require trigger mechanisms for immediate action if a fish mortality emergency is detected in the river."

Keith Wilkinson made a motion with Dave Bitts seconding: That the draft letter to NMFS be approved as amended. The motion passed unanimously.

Members suggested additional agencies that should receive a courtesy copy.

Agendum 19 (continued). Items for the April 1, 2001 agenda and assignments to the KRTAT, staff and members

Dave Hillemeier asked that the HAWG meet during the April meeting. He asked George Kautsky whether the KRTAT could provide a summary of the status of spring chinook, and whether a fishery impact rate on spring chinook could be calculated using Trinity River Hatchery fish as a surrogate. George Kautsky said a lot of the work has been done already, but it will depend on whether CDFG has assembled the data above the Junction City weir.

The KRTAT was assigned to provide a summary of the status of spring chinook to the HAWG when it meets in April.
